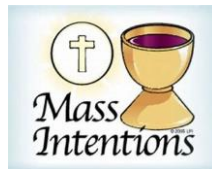
I have recently read the short book, *God and the Pandemic* by Tom Wright. Wright was the Anglican Bishop of Durham and is a recognised scripture scholar and academic. This book, however, is easily accessible and a brilliant reflection on the Coronavirus Pandemic and Christian faith. Wright starts by trying to find the deeper meaning of these times and asks, 'So does anyone know what's going on? Why is this happening? Is someone trying to tell us something?' I am sure that these questions echo in most of us as we stand bewildered before our broken and suffering world. But Tom Wright turns the questions around and instead of asking *why* this is all happening he looks back at the Christian response to the plagues in the early centuries and to the word *what* - 'what can we do about it?' In the early Christian times, believers risked their lives caring for the sick and when asked why, the response was something like, 'We are followers of this man Jesus. He put his life on the line to save us. So that's what we do as well.' Wright finds a parallel here with the many NHS staff and volunteers who have risked, and sometimes lost, their lives at this time.





Well I do not want to spoil the book for anyone who would like to read it, but there is a chapter which really stands out - the one called 'Where do we go from here? Why we must lament.' Tom Wright suggests that since St. Paul tells us to rejoice with those who rejoice and weep with those who weep, we should stand with those who mourn, those in pain and those in sorrow and add our own prayer of lamenting. We could use some of the psalms which lament for this, like number 10, 'Why, Lord, do you stand afar and pay no heed in times of trouble? or number 13, How long, Lord, will you utterly forget me?' Other psalms of lament include numbers 22 and 77.

God and the Pandemic is an excellent way for us to try to navigate our way through the pandemic and its difficulties at this time. Perhaps, if I could only take one thought from the book, it might be, 'The New Testament insists that we put Jesus at the centre of the picture and work outwards from there.'

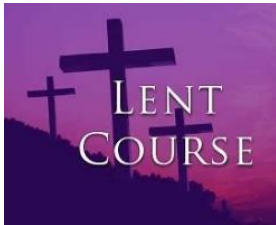
