ASH WEDNESDAY is on February 14th and marks the beginning of the holy season of Lent during which we can reflect on the words of Pope Francis, who reminds us that, "Christians are asked to return to God 'with all their hearts' (Joel 2:12), to refuse to settle for mediocrity and to grow in friendship with the Lord."
